

# 2019 Promoting Interoperability Stage 3 Measures and Exclusions

Objective	Measures
<b>Protect Patient Health Information</b>	Conduct or review a security risk analysis in accordance with the requirements in 45 CFR 164.308(a)(1), including addressing the security (to include encryption) of ePHI created or maintained by CEHRT in accordance with requirements under 45 CFR 164.312(a)(2)(iv) and 45 CFR 164.306(d)(3), <b>and</b> implement security updates as necessary and correct identified security deficiencies as part of the EP's risk management process
<b>E-Prescribe</b>	For 2019, <b>more than 60%</b> of permissible prescriptions written by the EP are queried for a drug formulary <b>and</b> transmitted electronically using CEHRT
<b>Clinical Decision Support (CDS)</b>	<b>For 2019</b> , EPs must attest to both of the following measures: <u>Measure 1:</u> Implement <b>5 clinical decision support</b> interventions related to 4 or more clinical quality measures at a relevant point in patient care for the entire EHR reporting period. Absent 4 clinical quality measures related to an EP's scope of practice or patient population, the clinical decision support interventions must be related to high-priority health conditions <b>and</b> <u>Measure 2:</u> The EP has enabled and implemented the functionality for drug-drug <b>and</b> drug-allergy interaction checks for the entire EHR reporting period
<b>Computerized Provider Order Entry (CPOE)</b>	<b>For 2019</b> , EPs must meet the thresholds for and attest to the following three measures: <u>Measure 1:</u> <b>More than 60%</b> of medication orders created by the EP during the EHR reporting period are recorded using CPOE <u>Measure 2:</u> <b>More than 60%</b> of lab orders created by the EP during the EHR reporting period are recorded using CPOE <u>Measure 3:</u> <b>More than 60%</b> percent of radiology orders created by the EP during the EHR reporting period are recorded using computerized provider order entry
<b>Patient Electronic Access to Health Information</b>	<b>For 2019</b> , EPs must attest to both of the following measures: <u>Measure 1:</u> <b>More than 80%</b> of all unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period are provided timely access to view online, download, and transmit to a third party their health information and the patient's health information is available for the patient to access using any application of their choice <u>Measure 2:</u> <b>More than 35%</b> of unique patients seen for an EHR reporting period in 2019 are provided electronic access to patient-specific educational resources using clinically relevant information identified from CEHRT
<b>Coordination of Care</b>	<b>For 2019</b> , EPs must meet the thresholds for at least two measures, but must attest to all three measures: <u>Measure 1:</u> For an EHR reporting period in 2019, for <b>more than 5%</b> of unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period, actively engage with the EHR by either 1) view, download or transmit to a third party their health information or 2) access their health information using an Application Programming Interface (API) or 3) a combination of (1) and (2) <u>Measure 2:</u> For an EHR reporting period in 2019, <b>for more than 5%</b> of unique patients seen by the EP during EHR reporting period, a secure message was sent using the electronic messaging function of CEHRT to the patient (or the patient-authorized representative), or in response to a secure message sent by patient (or the patient-authorized representative) during the EHR reporting period <u>Measure 3:</u> For an EHR reporting period in 2019, for <b>more than 5%</b> of unique patients seen by the EP during the EHR reporting period, patient generated health data or data from a nonclinical setting is incorporated into the CEHRT

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<b>Health Information Exchange (HIE)</b>	<p><b>For 2019, EPs meet the thresholds for at least two measures, but must attest to three measures:</b></p> <p><u>Measure 1:</u> The EP that transitions or refers their patient to another setting of care or provider of care must 1) use CEHRT to <b>create a summary of care record</b>; and 2) electronically transmit such summary to a receiving provider for <b>more than 50%</b> of transitions of care and referrals</p> <p><u>Measure 2:</u> For an EHR reporting period in 2019, the EP must incorporate an electronic summary of care document into the patient's EHR for <b>more than 40%</b> of transitions or referrals that the EP received and patient encounters in which the EP has never before encountered the patient</p> <p><u>Measure 3:</u> For an EHR reporting period in 2019, <b>more than 80%</b> of transitions and referrals received and patient encounters in which the provider has never encountered the patient, the EP must perform a clinical information reconciliation <b>for the following 3</b> clinical information sets: 1) medication 2) medication allergy and 3) current problem list</p>
<b>Public Health &amp; Clinical Data Registry Reporting</b>	<p><b>In 2019, EPs must attest to at least two of the following measures:</b></p> <p><u>Measure 1 - Immunization Registry Reporting:</u> The EP is in active engagement with a public health agency to submit immunization data and receive immunization forecasts and histories from the public health immunization registry/Immunization information system (IIS).</p> <p><u>Measure 2 – Syndromic Surveillance Reporting:</u> The EP is in active engagement with a public health agency to submit syndromic surveillance data from an urgent care setting.</p> <p><u>Measure 3 – Electronic Case Reporting:</u> The EP is in active engagement with a public health agency to submit case reporting of reportable conditions</p> <p><u>Measure 4 – Public Health Registry Reporting:</u> The EP is an active engagement with a public health agency to submit data to public health registries</p> <p><u>Measure 5 – Clinical Data Registry Reporting:</u> The EP is an active engagement to submit data to a clinical data registry</p>

Objective	Measure Exclusions
<b>Protect Patient Health Information</b>	<b>None</b>
<b>E-Prescribe</b>	Any EP who: Writes <b>fewer than 100 permissible prescriptions</b> during the EHR reporting period; <b>or</b> does not have a pharmacy within his or her organization and there are no pharmacies that accept electronic prescriptions within 10 miles of the EP's practice location at the start of his or her EHR reporting period.
<b>Clinical Decision Support (CDS)</b>	For the second measure, any EP who writes <b>fewer than 100 medication orders</b> during the EHR reporting period.
<b>Computerized Provider Order Entry (CPOE)</b>	<u>Measure 1:</u> Any EP who writes <b>fewer than 100 medication orders</b> during the EHR reporting period. <u>Measure 2:</u> Any EP who writes <b>fewer than 100 laboratory orders</b> during the EHR reporting period. <u>Measure 3:</u> Any EP who writes <b>fewer than 100 radiology orders</b> during the EHR reporting period.
<b>Patient Electronic Access</b>	<u>Measure 1:</u> Any EP who <b>neither orders nor creates</b> any of the information listed for inclusion as part of the measures except for "Patient Name" and "Provider's name and office contact information." <u>Measure 2:</u> Any EP who <b>neither orders nor creates</b> any of the information listed for inclusion as part of the measures except for "Patient Name" and "Provider's name and office contact information;" or conducts 50% or more of his or her patient encounters in a county that does not have 50% or more of its housing units with 4Mbps broadband availability according to the latest information available from the FCC on the first day of the EHR reporting period.
<b>Coordination of Care</b>	Any EP who has <b>no office visits</b> during the EHR reporting period, <b>or</b> any EP who conducts 50% or more of his or her patient encounters in a county that does not have 50% or more of its housing units with 4Mbps broadband availability according to the latest information available from the FCC on the first day of the EHR reporting period.
<b>Health Information Exchange (HIE)</b>	Any EP who transfers a patient to another setting or refers a patient to another provider <b>less than 100 times</b> during the EHR reporting period.

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<p><b>Public Health Reporting</b></p>	<p><u>Measure 1 Exclusions:</u> Any EP meeting one or more of the following criteria may be excluded from the immunization registry reporting measure if the EP— does not administer any immunizations to any of the populations for which data is collected by its jurisdiction's immunization registry or immunization information system during the EHR reporting period; operates in a jurisdiction for which no immunization registry or immunization information system is capable of accepting the specific standards required to meet the CEHRT definition at the start of the EHR reporting period; or operates in a jurisdiction where no immunization registry or immunization information system has declared readiness to receive immunization data from the EP at the start of the EHR reporting period.</p> <p><u>Measure 2 Exclusions:</u> Any EP meeting one or more of the following criteria may be excluded from the syndromic surveillance reporting measure if the EP— is not in a category of providers from which ambulatory syndromic surveillance data is collected by their jurisdiction's syndromic surveillance system; operates in a jurisdiction for which no public health agency is capable of receiving electronic syndromic surveillance data from EPs in the specific standards required to meet the CEHRT definition at the start of the EHR reporting period; or operates in a jurisdiction where no public health agency has declared readiness to receive syndromic surveillance data from EPs at the start of the EHR reporting period.</p> <p><u>Measure 3 Exclusions:</u> Any EP meeting at least one of the following criteria may be excluded from the specialized registry reporting measure if the EP— does not diagnose or treat any disease or condition associated with or collect relevant data that is required by a specialized registry in their jurisdiction during the EHR reporting period, operates in a jurisdiction for which no specialized registry is capable of accepting electronic registry transactions in the specific standards required to meet the CEHRT definition at the start of the EHR reporting period; or operates in a jurisdiction where no specialized registry for which the EP is eligible has declared readiness to receive electronic registry transactions at the beginning of the EHR reporting period.</p>
